Those who have seen the television show, “Wicked Tuna,” realize what an enormous fish these are, and how much of a fight they put up. In our area of the world, the resident tuna are Atlantic Bluefin, and they are respected as one of the ultimate challenges and experiences.

This is a bucket list fishing trip for many people throughout the world. These fish can often be over 1,000 pounds or more, and once one is hooked it can take well over several hours to bring them in to the boat!

Come experience the thrill of fishing the elusive giant bluefin tuna on board out of North Lake, PEI, the “Tuna Capital of the World”!

TARGET SPECIES



The answer here it's never been that easy! Tuna, tuna, tuna, and more tuna! Atlantic Bluefin tuna exactly!

Our exciting tuna fishing charter combines the adrenaline rush that comes from fighting a giant Bluefin tuna with the first class comfort and charm unique to that of Prince Edward Island. Our charter is fully guided and outfitted, combining local expertise and passion for tuna fishing with attention to the comfort and safety of our guests. A charter with us is the adventure of a lifetime, and one you will never forget.

Catching a wild Bluefin Tuna is the ultimate fishing experience and the catch of a lifetime! These behemoths are sought after for sports fishers because of their size, strength and stamina. They do not give up.

Eastern Prince Edward Island is a feeding ground for the giant Bluefin tuna that migrate here each year. They range in size from 400-1200 lbs (180 to 540 kg) and more. The tuna spend from July until October in our waters fattening up on mackerel and herring. Generally, by September they are over 700 lbs (317 kg). There are so many tuna here it's been called a stocked pond! Not only are the waters full of tuna, the grounds are very close to shore. It's a short sail to the fishing grounds, only 2 miles off shore!

Our charters offer catch and release experience, using barb-less circle hooks only, which supports the sustainability of the tuna stock.

ACCOMODATION



A Million Dollar View! Sagewill, a large oceanfront beach house rental with miles of pristine white singing sand beach and dunes out the door awaits your arrival!

This secluded two story open concept living beach house offers seven bedrooms and four bathrooms with all the comforts of home. Everything you will need for a memorable Prince Edward Island vacation can be found at this unique oceanfront summer rental. Just relax on the deck and be mesmerized by the beauty of our islands shore with its wildlife, soaring bald eagles and whales spouting in the distance. For those who want more activities can walk the miles of beach to the east and west, take the canoe for a paddle or try your hand at tennis and basketball on the tennis court located at the rental.

The main floor provides a fully equipped kitchen, dining room with seating for 12 and the living room with the wood burning island stone fireplace. Two bedrooms are located on the main floor; master has a queen bed and ensuite bathroom and second bedroom with queen. Another bathroom is located on the main floor as well as the sunporch, which has a second table, fridge and stove perfect for those large group rentals.

Second floor has four bedrooms, two bathrooms and sitting room. The 1st bedroom has a double bed and single bed, 2nd bedroom has a queen, 3rd has two singles, and 4th has a queen. The sitting room offers a queen pullout sofa as well as TV, and he patio doors lead out to the upstairs deck from this room.

The beach house is 15 minutes to the seaside town of Souris where you can find all needed amenities, and only 5 min away from North Lake. There are restaurants, grocery stores, liquor store, craft shops, fresh seafood, farmers market, health clinics Post Office and PEI tourism Information Centre.

BOAT



Our boats are designed with function and efficiency in mind, while paying strict attention to the safety and comfort of our crews & charters.

All of them carry top of the line gear, and we will supply gear depending on your fishing preferences. Each boat is equipped for fighting giants with stand-up high quality chair and gunnels. Our fishing captains and crews are all trained in first-aid with modern first-aid kits on board, and they really know what they are doing.... several championships of the Canada International Tuna Cup Challenge are in their hands!

Our captain's boats are Island-made, 45 foot fibreglass fishing vessels with a 15 wide beams, and they are powered by a smooth 430 horsepower diesel motor. They are roomy and comfortable including tables, bunks, wash room, propane stove, heater, and coolers.

All is equipped with modern electronics and is Transport Canada certified and inspected, meaning all safety equipment has been tested, stability tests have been successfully completed, and all mandatory fire fighting equipment is on board.

We take care of all the gear. You have your choice of custom-built stand-up gear, tuna fighting chair or fixed pole. Or if you have your own gear, you're more than welcome to take it aboard.

SURROUNDINGS

Prince Edward Island is in the Atlantic Time Zone, which is UTC-4 hours. When it is noon in Prince Edward Island, it is 8:00 a.m. in Vancouver, 10:00 a.m. in Chicago, 11:00 a.m. in Toronto, Montréal, Boston and New York, 4:00 p.m. in London, England and midnight in Perth, Australia.

Visitors from international locations must carry a valid passport and visa, if required.

The Canadian dollar is the currency used on Prince Edward Island. Many operators and retailers will accept American dollars, but not always at the official exchange rate. Businesses do not typically accept other foreign currencies. It is recommended that you convert your national currency into Canadian dollars before travelling to PEI.

You can't beat summer on PEI. But every year more and more people are discovering the treasures to be found in spring, fall and winter. Travel heritage byways when the fall foliage borders red clay roads in a thousand shades of red and gold. And nothing beats the taste of lobster in early May, when the lobster season first opens.
